State Validations

If you are planning on exhibiting a market lamb, meat goat or market barrow at the 2013 State Fair in Dallas, it is time to be ordering your tags for those animals. These tags will validate only lambs, goats and barrows for the State Fair. Tag orders must be in to the Extension office no later than Friday, April 19th, 2012. Each tag will cost \$10.00 and will need to be paid at the time of ordering. The actual validation process will be held in June.

Steer Tags will also be due! Exhibitors who plan to show steers for the 2013-2014 show season will need to place their orders on the number of tags needed for show animals. Steer Tags will also cost \$10.00 each and orders are also due by Friday, April 19th. Validation will be done on steers before June 30th deadline.

Anyone interested in showing steers **anytime** next year **OR** plan to show market animals in the fall (October) at the State Fair in Dallas, will need to contact the office and place their order for the number of tags they plan to purchase. These deadlines apply to 4-H AND any FFA members in the county so feel free to pass along to any others who might have an interest. 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their registration papers or the Grade Horse Form as well as \$10 per horse. These requirements are being made by the State 4-H horse program. **NEW THIS Year - the validation process can be completed online thru 4-H CONNECT. Hopefully everyone has received a copy of these changes. If you have questions - regarding this process, please feel free to give us a call.

ALSO DUE IS paperwork for nominations for anyone entering the futurity. Please note that if someone is going to exhibit a futurity horse, the exhibitor must be at least 12 years old by September of 2012.

We MUST receive the completed validation form, a copy of registration papers for registered horses and a completed grade horse form for non-registered horses for each horse that is to compete in the district and/or state horse show. All of these forms are due to our office by **May 1**.

NO EXCEPTIONS!!!!!!!

**THIS YEAR FOR COUNTY CAMP!

Just a reminder for ALL persons interested in attending the annual County Camp at the Texas 4-H Center at Lake Brownwood, there is a process for registering. ALL RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENTS FOR THE CAMP will be done thru a registration process thru the Texas 4-H Center website. It is a completely separate program from 4-H CON-NECT so unless you registered for county camp last year - you will need to sign up as a new user.

The 4-H Center will NOT be using 4-H Connect for camp registrations this summer. Rather, all registrations will be conducted on ActiveNetwork Camps, a camp industry registration program. This is an easy to use registration system, but requires the individual family to register. With this new registration program, the counties will not be approving registrations as they do on 4-H Connect. The direct link to register for camps is on the 4-H Center website, http://texas4hcenter.tamu.edu If you registered for camp last year, you should be able to login again as the same. If you

have any questions, please let me know.

The deadline for registration is June 14 but LATE registration will be accept up until June 23rd. Total cost for the camp is \$175 per camper, and \$80 for chaperones. After the June 14th date, registration will be an additional 5% and ALL registration and FULL payments must be paid by June 23rd. Complete payment or deposit can be made at the time of registration using credit card or electronic personal check.

The annual county camp is open to anyone! All 4-H members AND non-members must be between the ages of 9 yrs old and completed 2nd grade thru 19 years old. You DO NOT have to be a member of 4-H to attend county camp. County groups are housed together in the dorms by gender and Tom Green County 4-Hers will be attending at the same time as neighboring Runnels, Schleicher, and Irion counties (Session II, July 8-10) We have slots reserved for individuals to participate but you must register in advance to attend.

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District 4-H Fashion Show—Sr. Division

The Senior Division of the District 4-H Fashion Show will be held on Saturday, May 4th, 2013 in conjunction with District Roundup. Participants must be 14-18 years old as of August 31, 2012. A total of 8 members (4 Construction & 4 Buying) can be sent from each county in categories of Casual, Dressy, Formal and speciality. CAMPS-Summer 2013

Concho Valley Safety Day - The Ag Safety Day sponsored by Progressive Farmer is scheduled to be held on Friday, June 7th at the Tom Green 4-H Building. This fun-filled day will include demonstrations and discussions of safety topics related to farm and home safety. Ages include 3rd thru 8th grade, including those entering 3rd grade this year are eligible. Only first 125 paid campers will be accepted. The fee includes lunch, snacks, t-shirts, and a bag of goodies. More info and registration forms will be available at a later date.

County Camp- Dates are scheduled for 2:00pm on July 8th thru 11:00 am on July 10th, 2013. All youth ages (9-18 yrs old) are eligible to attend. Persons do NOT have to be a 4-H member to attend. Cost will be \$175.00 for youth and \$80 for Adults which must be cleared with background checks to be eligible to register and attend. All registration will be done thru the online Registration program under the Texas 4-H Center site and payments can be made using credit card. Registration begins on March 1st thru June 14th with late registration to be held June 15-23 with a 5% increase as late fee.. Adult volunteers are welcomed!

Prime-Time - especially designed for younger youth with opportunities to meet new friends, develop new skills, and learn how to work with others. 3 night, 4 day event and covers all meals, lodging, refreshments, health care service, facility and programming fees. 4-H membership is NOT a requirement to participate in camp. Registrations will be accepted on a first come first served basis until the camp is filled and opens thru 4-H Connect on March 1st to July 12th.

Session I -grades 5-8, July 21-24; Total Cost \$225 per participant Session II-grades 2-5, July 24-27; Total Cost \$225 per participant Camp enrollment is based on grade completed in spring, 2013 & 4-H membership is NOT required to participate in any camp.

Horizons Camp - is a camp for youth completed grades 4th - 8th and featuring six different 4-H project learning programs. Each participant will select from one of the six programs to be offered and will also include many fun activities at 4-H Center such as dancing, swimming and lots more. The camp will be held June 4th - 8th with cost to be total of \$275. **Registration begins March 1st** via the Texas 4-H Center website and will be accepted on a first come first served basis until the camp is filled.

<u>District 7 Leadership Lab</u> - to be held June 25th thru June 28th to be held in Sacramento, New Mexico. Estimated cost will be \$300 per person (youth & Adults). District officers for the new year will be elected at this time. Registration will open on 4-H CONNECT on May 15th thru June 3rd. Camp is open to 7th, 8th or 9th grade students; registration is \$250 per participant and will be held in College Station. Participants DO NOT have to be 4-H members to attend and Registration opens March 1st on 4-H CONNECT. 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The following is information on the upcoming District 7 Leadership Lab which will take place at the Sacramento Assembly-Camp & Conference Center; Sacramento, New Mexico. This year's Lab will include other 4-Hers from District 7 and participants must be at least 13 years of age by the date of Leadership Lab. Cost is \$300 per person for youths and includes 8 meals, 3 nights lodging, limited insurance, a T-shirt, and more! This does include transportation to and from New Mexico and there will be 3 outstanding & innovative session that will help build your leadership & teamwork skills. NO REFUNDS after registration has been made on 4-H CONNECT.

Registration will be open May 15th thru June 3, 2013 with late registration open from June 4-June 6, 2013 with an additional \$20 late fee charged to the participant. Registrants must pay for the event using a credit card. There is no limit on registration numbers. Every participant must complete a Health & Release form packet which will be made available during the registration process on 4-H CONNECT.

One of the major events of lab will be the election of officers for the District 7 4-H Council. Interested applicants should submit a copy of Council Officer Application form to the District Office no later than due date of June 3, 2013. All eligible applicants will be introduced and allowed the opportunity to give a talk on 4-H (3 minutes) and election will be by secret ballot. Those Council officers elected as President, vice-President and Delegate-at-large, must also serve as State Officers on the Texas 4-H Council and must be 16 years of age and not reached their 19th birthday on or before August 31, 2013 and REQUIRED to attend the State 4-H Council Workshop - set for July 22-25, 2013 at Texas 4-H Center in Brownwood. If you cannot attend this training, you CAN-NOT run for these 3 offices.

All other officers must be 15 years of age and not reached their 19th birthday on or before August 31, 3013. ALL District 7 officers are required to attend the officer training set for July 25-26, 2013.

Texas 4-H Golf Challenge



The Texas 4-H and Youth Development Program is pleased to announce the Texas 4-H Golf Challenge. The Texas 4-H Golf Challenge was developed by county Extension agents, 4-H Specialists, and others to provide youth the opportunity to compete in an outdoor sporting event. While competing, youth also have the opportunity to gain invaluable knowledge in the areas of sports nutrition, golf course and turf grass management, and the rules and etiquette of golf. The Texas 4-H Golf Challenge was developed after a number of important statistics were identified.

- Twenty-three UIL sanctioned events give more than one million student-athletes the opportunity to compete.
- 16.3% of youth ages 2-19 are obese (2003-2006,
- The United States is losing two acres of mostly prime farmland every minute to development (2002, American Farmland Trust).

Why are all three of these statistics important? Youth love to compete in athletic events, Texas and the U.S. is experiencing a serious obesity problem in youth, and people must become more aware of how urban sprawl is affecting the land around us and the opportunities that are present as a result of this sprawl. Incorporating an event like the Texas 4-H Golf Challenge will give youth the opportunity to compete in an athletic event while understanding sports nutrition, the rules and etiquette of golf, and learn about the opportunities present in golf course & turf grass management.
